





when she first moved back west after nearly a decade away, Amanda Lewis was an overachieving, burned-out book editor most familiar with trees as dead blocks of paper. A dedicated "indoorswoman," she could barely tell a birch from a beech. But that didn't stop her from pledging to visit all of the biggest trees in British Columbia, a Canadian province known for its rugged terrain and gigantic trees.


The "Champion" trees on Lewis's ambitious list ranged from mighty Western red cedars to towering arbutus. They lived on remote islands and at the center of dense forests. The only problem? Well, there were many... Climate change and a pandemic aside, Lewis's lack of wilderness experience, the upsetting reality of old-growth logging, the ever-changing nature of trees, and the pressures of her one-year timeframe complicated her quest. Burned out again—and realizing that her "checklist" approach to life might be the problem—she reframed her search for trees to something humbler and more meaningful: getting to know forests in an interconnected way.

Weaving in insights from writers and artists, Lewis uncovers what we're really after when we pursue the big things—revealing that sometimes it's the smaller joys, the mindsets we have, and the companions we're with that make us feel more connected to the natural world.

AMANDA LEWIS is a big-tree tracker and an award-winning book editor. Born in Dublin, Ireland, she now divides her time between the internet and a small island in British Columbia, Canada. *Tracking Giants* is her first book. Visit her at amandalewis.org.




A father and son ascend a mountain together for the first time, retracing the steps of a young boy who went missing a century earlier.

SIX-YEAR-OLD HANS TORSKE disappeared in Norway's Skrim mountains in 1894. Why he wandered away from his family's cabin is still a mystery, but his body was found the following summer, lying atop a 2,860-foot mountain peak and covered with his thin jacket. 




IN THIS RESTORATIVE little book, best enjoyed in one sitting on a spring day, an adventurous young boy who traveled the world in his mind meets the old man he becomes, and together they build a new garden in a neglected plot behind his house on the edge of town.

Alternate chapters follow author and professional gardener Marc Hamer as a child and, in his current life, as a sixty-five-year-old. Hamer weaves practical gardening knowledge through these two memoir strands as he describes the planning and planting of his small new garden near Cardiff, Wales.

In the words of Hamer, "Spring Rain is about the joy of your own back garden. It is a story about the joy of small things, the world in a grain of sand, a universe in a small garden, with love for all the insects and slugs and flowers and weeds and seeds and roots and boundaries and shade and weather that the garden contains."

MARC HAMER was born in the north of England and moved to Wales over thirty years ago. After spending a period homeless, then working on the railway, he returned to education and studied fine art. He has worked in art galleries, marketing, graphic design and taught creative writing in a prison before becoming a gardener. His previous books, *How to Catch a Mole* and *Seed to Dust*, were both Indie Next picks and shortlisted for the Wainwright Prize.



WHEN BIOLOGIST HANNA BJØRGAAS spots a beautiful fairy cup lichen in Antarctica, she is surprised to recognize it from her own backyard in Oslo. So begins Bjørgaas's deep dive into urban nature. In Secret Life of the City, she takes us to city parks, cemeteries, and concrete rooftops to investigate some of the species that live in urban spaces. We meet corvids, songbirds, ants, pigeons, bats, sparrows, lichen, fungi, and linden trees—and the experts who study their surprising abilities to survive, and thrive, in the city.


As Bjørgaas discovers, urban nature—and its unique mixture of species that have never lived together before in Earth's history—is valuable. More than half of the world's human population lives in densely populated areas—and plants and animals have followed us into cities. Secret Life of the City invites us to pay closer attention to the sounds, sights, and smells of urban nature. A treasure trove of fascinating flora and fauna, this wonderful book offers a plea to save our city plants, animals, and fungi before we lose them too.

HANNA BJØRGAAS is a biologist who has worked as a guide in the Arctic and Antarctic, led field courses in Norway, and worked with architects and artists to help communicate the joy of nature to others. She has written articles on popular science and contributed to conferences on ecology and farming. Bjørgaas admits to feeling a bit naked without a pair of binoculars and a magnifying glass hanging around her neck.





AS A GITXSAN teenager navigating life on the streets, Angela Sterritt wrote in her journal to help her survive and find her place in the world. In her brilliant debut, Sterritt shares her memoir alongside investigative reporting on cases of missing and murdered Indigenous women in Canada, showing how colonialism and racism have led to a society where Sterritt struggled to survive as a young person, and where the lives of Indigenous women and girls are ignored and devalued.

"She could have been me," Sterritt acknowledges throughout the book, and her empathy for victims, survivors, and families drives her present-day investigations. In the end, Sterritt steps into a place of power, demanding accountability from the media and the public, exposing racism, and showing that there is much work to do on the path towards understanding the truth. But most importantly, she proves that the strength and brilliance of Indigenous women are unbroken, and that, together, they can build lives of joy and abundance.

ANGELA STERRITT is an award-winning journalist, writer, and artist. Sterritt has worked as a journalist for close to twenty years and has been with the CBC since 2003. She currently works with CBC Vancouver as a host and television, radio, and digital reporter. She is a proud member of the Gitxsan Nation and lives on xwməθkwəýəm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), and s lílw ta (Tsleil-Waututh) territories in Vancouver, Canada.




This exploration of the many new terms created during the COVID-19 pandemic provides insight into the ways in which an ever-evolving vocabulary helped us cope with our anxiety and adapt to a new reality.

WHEN THE PANDEMIC struck in early 2020, Wayne Grady started collecting the words and phrases that arose from our shared global experience. Some, such as "uptick" and "pivot," had existed before but now took on new meaning, and others, such as "covidivorce," "quarantini," "covexit," and "shecession" appeared for the first time, their meaning instantly clear. Through this new vocabulary, we became more adaptable to change, domesticating it and reducing our fears.

Moving from the very beginning of the pandemic (and the preceding "Before Times") and our early response to it, through the peaks and troughs of the various waves in countries throughout the world, and ending with a contemplation of what the "After Times" might look like, this book takes us on a journey through the pandemic. It illuminates both how this new language has unfolded and how it has changed the way we think about ourselves and each other.

wayne grady is the author of three novels and more than a dozen books of nonfiction. His many awards include four Science in Society Awards, the Amazon.ca First Novel Award, the Governor General's Award for English Translation, and the National Outdoor Book Award. He lives in Kingston, Ontario, and San Miguel de Allende, Mexico.
