
On the Sixth Day Alessandra Sanguinetti







Explores themes of place, home, and belonging through work made while living alongside migrant communities in Calais



Surveillance is for now a naked, feathered horse grounded for one news cycle onto the front page of every techno-illuminated broadsheet.

The pixelated Pegasus, equestrian eavesdropper is here lifted out of the electronic ether and into its proper place; center stage in the dramaturgy of listening.

For half a reel of hailstorms we can hear a patched history of this furtive gelding, until it takes flight in a new form and we can quietly attend to those at work and whispering cut of earshot in the wings.

Can I hear you, if we are unheard by horses?
