


# **ABOUT THE FDITOR**



Union. He attended college late in life. He ran and was elected Chief of the Mississaugas of the Anishinaabe in December 2015. He is an honourary Senior Fellow of Massey College at the University of Toronto and he recently led a delegation to the UK, Scotland, and the Isle of Man. He was the first Giima (Chief) to meet with the British Monarch in over 160 years.




# ABOUT THE AUTHOR






# THE AUTHORS AND EDITORS
