
From celebrated Haida artist Michael Nicoll Yahgulanaas comes a striking new collection tracing the origins and evolution of Haida Manga—a bold visual genre that blends North Pacific Indigenous iconography and framelines with the dynamic energy of graphic storytelling.

INSPIRED BY THE SUCCESSFUL resistance to industrial logging in Haida Gwaii, Michael Nicoll Yahgulanaas conceived Haida Manga as a graphic and literary bridge: a way to connect diverse audiences to the lived experiences, values and sovereignty of Indigenous Peoples in an unconquered land.

This volume brings together a curated selection of black-and-white ink works—some previously published, others newly created—exploring how a sophisticated Indigenous visual tradition can function as sequential narrative art.

Provocative, experimental, accessible and deeply rooted in place, this is essential reading for anyone interested in contemporary Indigenous art, environmental justice and the power of visual storytelling.

MICHAEL NICOLL YAHGULANAAS is a visual artist, storyteller and public speaker. Raised on Haida Gwaii, he melds cultural hybridity and his political experiences as an Indigenous person with contemporary graphic literature to produce a unique genre called Haida Manga. His books include *Red*, *Carpe Fin* and *JAJ* (2009, 2019 and 2023). He lives in British Columbia with his wife and daughter, close to the Two Sisters Mountain on an island in the Salish Sea, and has a studio in West Vancouver, BC.

From Ragged Ass Road to Rideau Hall

Stories of the North

WHIT FRASER

Veteran journalist Whit Fraser recounts the stories behind the stories in this collection of tales drawn from fifty years of reporting on nation-changing events in Canada's North.

IN THIS GRIPPING MEMOIR, journalist Whit Fraser takes readers behind the headlines of his long career, which started as a reporter in Frobisher Bay and Yellowknife in the late 1960s. From the crash of the Russian satellite *Cosmos 954* in 1978, to the *Ocean Ranger* oil rig disaster in 1982, and the devastating *Exxon Valdez* spill in 1989, Fraser recounts pivotal moments that shaped public opinion and policy in Canada.

At the heart of the book is Fraser's deep engagement with the North and the fight for Indigenous self-determination. He reports on landmark events such as the patriation of the Constitution, the creation of Nunavut, and papal visits to the Arctic. As Viceregal Consort to Governor General Mary Simon, Fraser also offers insider insights into her decades of activism and leadership.

Anchored by vivid reporting and personal reflection, *From Ragged Ass Road to Rideau Hall* is a powerful journey through the people, politics, and places that have defined Canada's North—and the shifting landscape of journalism itself.

WHIT FRASER is a journalist, broadcaster, author, and spouse of Canada's Governor General, Mary Simon. Over his long career with the CBC, he has covered Arctic news, worked for eight years on Parliament Hill, and worked as a primetime anchor for CBC Newsworld. Fraser was the founding chair of the Canadian Polar Commission (1991–97) and executive director of Inuit Tapiriit Kanatami (2001–06), an organization founded in 1971 to give national representation to Inuit voices. He is the author of *True North Rising* (Penguin, 2019), a memoir which won the NorthWords Book Prize, and *Cold Edge of Heaven* (Boulder Books, 2022). Fraser and Simon now live at Rideau Hall in Ottawa where they continue in public service.



The Astronaut Children of Dunbar Street

A Memoir

WILEY WEI-CHIUN HO

The Astronaut Children of Dunbar Street is an intimate geopolitical memoir about a family separated by distance and borders, split between Taiwan and Canada in the wake of shifting global powers.

IN 1979, FOLLOWING THE US—Taiwan break in diplomatic relations, a family emigrates from Taiwan to Canada—only to arrive in the midst of a deep recession. With few job prospects, the parents make a wrenching decision: to return to Taiwan for work, leaving their children behind in Vancouver. At just twelve years old, Wiley, the youngest child, suddenly finds herself unsupervised with only two rules to live by: study hard and stay out of trouble.

What begins as freedom soon gives way to homesickness, cultural dislocation and isolation. The siblings struggle in different ways, but once a month, during brief overseas phone calls, they gather to maintain the illusion of stability for their guilt-ridden parents. The separation grows from months to years. The family is never whole again.

The story of this fractured household parallels Taiwan's own ongoing struggle for survival, identity and recognition—much like its children, scattered across the globe. The memoir draws a powerful connection between personal and political displacement, revealing a hidden history of resilience among transnational families.

While countless "astronaut children" and "parachute kids" have grown up in Canada, the us, Australia and New Zealand, their stories remain largely absent from the literary landscape. *The Astronaut Children of Dunbar Street* brings their experience into urgent and unforgettable focus.

WILEY WEI-CHIUN HO has published short stories and personal essays in PRISM international, Ricepaper Magazine, River Teeth, Room and several anthologies, and was a finalist for the 2021 Jim Wong-Chu Award for Emerging Writers (presented by the Asian Canadian Writers' Workshop). She lives in North Vancouver, BC, where she likes to grow Asian vegetables in her front yard. The Astronaut Children of Dunbar Street is her first book.



The Philosophy and Practice of Living Well on a Small Budget



Cheapskate in Lotusland is an entertaining and exuberant testament to the philosophy and practice of frugality and an invitation to live better by living within one's means.

SET IN VANCOUVER, ONE of North America's most expensive cities, this wry and insightful book offers writer Steve Burgess's account of living well without ever earning much. With over three decades in Vancouver, Steve Burgess has watched his rent more than triple while his income has stubbornly hovered in the same bracket. By some financial measures, he qualifies as poor. Yet with a home near Stanley Park, a well-stocked kitchen, money saved, and plenty of stamps in his passport, he is, by most measures that matter, doing just fine.

Blending personal memoir, economic philosophy, and sharp social observation, this book explores frugality as a way of life rather than a sacrifice. From mastering grocery store bargains to questioning the relentless push of consumerism, the author offers lessons in living comfortably on less—without deprivation or despair. Along the way, he engages with experts, literature, and other everyday people to reveal how financial security isn't always about numbers—it's about priorities, perspective and knowing the value of a good pair of shoes.

STEVE BURGESS is a writer and broadcaster whose honours include two Canadian National Magazine awards. Burgess is a contributing editor of The Tyee and an award-winning documentary director. He is also the author of *Reservations*: *The Pleasures and Perils of Travel* (2024) which was longlisted for the Leacock Medal. His stories have been featured in publications including Reader's Digest, Maclean's and The Globe and Mail. He lives in Vancouver, BC.



Will Ferguson recounts the small, revealing moments of a travel-writing career in this funny, eclectic collection of essays—and opinions—on Canada, the writing life and the world beyond.

FROM THE ARCTIC CIRCLE to the mud pools of New Zealand, Will Ferguson has spent a career chasing stories that reveal as much about Canada as they do about the world. Meanwhile, Back in Nokomis brings together his funniest, sharpest and most surprising adventures collected here for the first time. Ferguson brings readers on a journey, from a tiny theatre town in rural Alberta to the haunted (and horsegrazed) shores of Sable Island off the coast of Nova Scotia. He weighs the benefits and drawbacks of the Confederation Bridge, wanders the jumbled cultural mixture of Montréal's neighbourhoods and confronts his queasy relationship with Scottish whisky.

In between, Ferguson muses about the defining elements of Canadian culture and offers readers some writerly advice. He ponders the merits of selling out to advertisers, Canada's national reputation for peacekeeping and the most frequently asked questions in literary interviews. He also offers his thoughts on the real questions: What's the most Canadian condiment? The best contender for a national bird? And why didn't he get the handyman gene? With his trademark humour and a sincere appreciation for Canada and beyond, Ferguson roams through a life of travel, writing and the moments in between from a distinctly Canadian point of view.

WILL FERGUSON is an award-winning novelist and travel writer whose global adventures include trekking five hundred miles across Northern Ireland, road-tripping through Rwanda and hitchhiking the length of Japan. He is a three-time winner of the Leacock Medal for Humour, and his novel 419 won the 2012 Giller Prize for Fiction. His work has been published in twenty-three languages. He lives in Calgary, AB.

A Great NHL Referee Tells All

ROB SIMPSON WITH BILL MCCREARY

A candid and wildly entertaining account that offers hockey fans and sports history enthusiasts a rare, behind-the-scenes look at the game's most pivotal moments from the perspective of one of its most respected referees.

NO ONE HAS SEEN more, heard more, or called more than Bill McCreary.

From the raucous benches to the heart-stopping moments of hockey's biggest games, *Stories from Ice Level* offers an unfiltered look at the sport through the eyes of one of the most respected officials in NHL history. A 2014 inductee into the Hockey Hall of Fame, McCreary officiated more Stanley Cup Final games than anyone else in league history and was front and centre at the most iconic international showdowns of the modern era.

Whether it's wild locker room moments, on-ice brawls, calling Sidney Crosby's Golden Goal, or handling death threats against Mario Lemieux, McCreary brings fans deep into the game's gritty, gutsy and often deeply personal moments, sharing the stories that only someone wearing the stripes can tell.

ROB SIMPSON first covered the NHL as a teenager in November 1981. Since those early days of getting paid under the table to ask questions and record postgame sound at Detroit Red Wings games, "Simmer" has gone on to host national NHL radio and TV programs, serve as a playby-play commentator and ice-level reporter for regional and national networks in two countries, and produce and host hockey-related documentaries. He is the author of four hockey books, including *Between the Lines* (HarperCollins Canada, 2006), the biography of Hall of Fame linesman Ray "Scampy" Scapinello. Simpson continues to cover the NHL in Vancouver, BC, where he resides, and in Seattle, WA.

BILL MCCREARY is the only referee to be inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame this millennium. That honour marked the culmination of a thirty-year on-ice career that included more than 1,700 regular season games and 297 playoff matches. He officiated a record 44 Stanley Cup Final games, appearing in 15 Final series. "Mac" also earned the distinction of refereeing three Olympic gold medal games—Nagano 1998 (the NHL's first Olympic participation), Salt Lake City 2002, and Vancouver 2010. He continued his work with the league as an off-ice supervisor of officials through the 2023–24 season. He lives in Thornbury, ON.






French Canadian psychologist Dr. Annick Boudreau helps patients in her West Coast cognitive behavioral therapy practice, solving crimes along the way.

WHEN DR. ANNICK BOUDREAU'S clinical partner teams up with a Vancouver musical legend—1980s hardcore punk icon turned latemiddle-aged Zen sage "Wobbly" Robbie Milne—to launch a mindfulness app, she is supportive, if a little skeptical. After all, she's got other things to focus on: like a baby on the way and a father-to-be who seems ready to fully domesticate their lives with or without her. But when one of Wobbly Robbie's former bandmates is shot dead, suspicions soon turn to another ex-member of the group, and Robbie, true to his punk rock roots, doesn't trust the police with the investigation. He's heard about Annick's unique skills, and very quickly, the doctor finds that she is drawn in, despite her better judgment. When, in the midst of all this, an old flame from her Montreal days appears, Dr. Boudreau may finally be in over her head.

The Smiling Buddha Reunion is the third in a series of mysteries starring Dr. Annick Boudreau and exploring themes of mental health this time, anxiety. In a refreshing take on the sleuth genre, author (and longtime CBT patient) Charles Demers deftly reveals a particular aspect of psychology practice in each book, illuminating shadowy subject matter with masterful sensitivity and sharp wit.

CHARLES DEMERS is an author, comedian, voice actor, and playwright. He is a frequently returning star on CBC Radio's smash-hit comedy The Debaters, with a weekly listening audience of 750,000. His collection of essays, Vancouver Special (Arsenal Pulp Press, 2009), was shortlisted for the Hubert Evans Non-fiction Prize. He is also the author of The Horrors (2015), Property Values (Arsenal Pulp Press, 2018) and the first two books in the Doctor Annick Boudreau Mystery series, Primary Obsessions and Noonday Dark (2020 and 2022), for which he draws upon his own long-time experience with cognitive behavioural therapy. Demers lives in Vancouver, BC.







ONE DRUM WELCOMES readers to unite in ceremony to heal themselves and bring harmony to their lives and communities. Wagamese wrote, "I am not a shaman. Nor am I an elder, a pipe carrier, or a celebrated traditionalist. I am merely one who has trudged the same path many of this human family has—the path of the seeker, called forward by a yearning I have not always understood."

One Drum draws from the foundational teachings of Ojibway tradition, the Grandfather Teachings. Focusing specifically on the lessons of humility, respect and courage, the volume contains simple ceremonies that anyone anywhere can do, alone or in a group, to foster harmony and connection. Wagamese believed that there is a shaman in each of us, and we are all teachers and in the world of the spirit there is no right way or wrong way. Writing of neglect, abuse and loss of identity, Wagamese recalled living on the street, going to jail, drinking too much, feeling rootless and afraid, and then the feeling of hope he gained from connecting with the spiritual ways of his people. He expressed the belief that ceremony has the power to unify and to heal for people of all backgrounds.

IN 2005, AWARD-WINNING writer Richard Wagamese moved with his partner to a cabin outside Kamloops, BC. In the crisp mountain air Wagamese felt a peace he'd seldom known before. Abused and abandoned as a kid, he'd grown up feeling there was nowhere he belonged. For years, only alcohol and moves from town to town seemed to ease the pain.

FOR AS LONG as Lawson can remember, his life in a small Northwest Territories town has revolved around "the Treaty" between the Dogrib and the Chipewyan, set down centuries ago to prevent the return of bloody warfare between the two peoples. On the Dogrib side, Lawson and his family have done their best to keep the pact alive, but their counterparts on the Chipewyan side offer little more than scowls and derision in return. Worse still, it seems that one of the Cranes' boys is doing all he can to revive the old conflict: Silver, fresh out of jail, has placed himself in the service of a cruel, ghoulish spirit bent on destroying the peace. 






Get ready for illegal wrestling moves, pinky promises, a doctored casino, extraterrestrials or "Sky People," love, lust and prayers for peace. While this is Van Camp's most hilarious short story collection, it's also haunted by the lurking presence of the Wheetago, human-devouring monsters of legend that have returned due to global warming and the greed of humanity. The stories in Moccasin Square Gardens show that medicine power always comes with a price. To counteract this darkness, Van Camp weaves a funny and loving portrayal of the Tłicho Dene and other communities of the North, drawing from oral history techniques to perfectly capture the character and texture of everyday small-town life. "Moccasin Square Gardens" is the nickname of a dance hall in the town of Fort Smith that serves as a meeting place for a small but diverse community. In the same way, the collection functions as a meeting place for an assortment of characters, from shamans and time-travelling goddess warriors to pop-culture-obsessed pencil pushers, to con artists, archivists and men who just need to grow up, all seeking some form of connection.

DRAWING ON BOTH lived experience and cultural memory, Norma Dunning brings together six powerful new short stories centred on modern-day Inuk characters. Ranging from homeless to extravagantly wealthy, from spiritual to jaded, young to elderly, and even from alive to deceased, Dunning's characters are united by shared feelings of alienation, displacement and loneliness resulting from their experiences in southern Canada. In Tainna—meaning "the unseen ones" and pronounced Da-e-nn-a—a fraught reunion between sisters Sila and Amak ends in an uneasy understanding. From the spirit realm, Chevy Bass watches over his imperilled grandson, Kunak. And in the title story, the broken-hearted Bunny wanders onto a golf course on a freezing night, when a flock of geese stand vigil until her body is discovered by a kind stranger.

Norma Dunning's masterful storytelling uses humour and incisive detail to create compelling characters who discover themselves in a hostile land where prejudice, misogyny and inequity are most often found hidden in plain sight. There, they must rely on their wits, artistic talent, senses of humour and spirituality for survival; and there, too, they find solace in shining moments of reconnection with their families and communities.







A FORGOTTEN HAUDENOSAUNEE social song beams into the cosmos like a homing beacon for interstellar visitors. A computer learns to feel sadness and grief from the history of atrocities committed against First Nations. A young Native man discovers the secret to time travel in ancient petroglyphs. Drawing inspiration from science fiction legends like Arthur C. Clarke, Isaac Asimov and Ray Bradbury, Drew Hayden Taylor frames classic science-fiction tropes in an Aboriginal perspective. The nine stories in this collection span all traditional topics of science fiction—from peaceful aliens to hostile invaders; from space travel to time travel; from government conspiracies to connections across generations. Yet Taylor's First Nations perspective draws fresh parallels, likening the cultural implications of alien contact to those of the arrival of Europeans in the Americas, or highlighting the impossibility of remaining a "good Native" in such an unnatural situation as a space mission. Infused with Native stories and variously mysterious, magical and humorous, Take Us to Your Chief is the perfect mesh of nostalgically 1950s-esque science fiction with modern First Nations discourse.

Man Changing into Thunderbird

NORVAL MORRISSEAU (1932–2007), Ojibway shaman-artist, drew his first sketches at age six in the sand on the shores of Lake Nipigon, and his first paintings were in cheap watercolour on birch bark and moose hide. By the end of his tumultuous life, the prolific self-taught artist was sought by collectors, imitated by forgers and a recipient of the Order of Canada. Critics, art historians and curators alike consider him one of the most innovative artists of the twentieth century and arguably Canada's greatest painter. Morrisseau was a controversial figure too. Living on booze, flat broke and exhausted, he often traded art for a drink. Despite immense talent and success, his alcoholism plunged his wife and children into poverty and he spent years bouncing between skid row and jail.

In Norval Morrisseau: Man Changing Into Thunderbird, Ruffo draws upon years of extensive research, including interviews with Morrisseau himself, to recollect the artist's life in all its triumphs and tragedies: his first solo and breakthrough exhibition at the Pollock Gallery in Toronto; his legendary "Garden Party" where he flew a coterie of critics and patrons to remote Beardmore for an afternoon tea party; his heart-wrenching battle with alcoholism, then Parkinson's disease, and exultant "Shaman's Return" to national status in the Canadian art scene.

What's Your Name? The Eskimo Disc System and a Daughter's Search for her Grandmother

IN 2001, DR. NORMA Dunning applied to the Nunavut Beneficiary program, requesting enrolment to legally solidify her existence as an Inuk woman. But she was faced with a question she could not answer, tied to a colonial institution retired decades ago: "What was your disc number?"

Still haunted by this question years later, Dunning took it upon herself to reach out to Inuit community members who experienced the Eskimo Identification Tag System first-hand, providing vital perspective and nuance to the scant records available on the subject. Written with incisive detail and passion, Dunning provides readers with a comprehensive look into a bureaucracy sustained by the Canadian government for over thirty years, neglected by history books but with lasting echoes revealed in Dunning's intimate interviews with affected community members. Not one government has taken responsibility or apologized for the E-number system to date—a symbol of the blatant dehumanizing treatment of the smallest Indigenous population in Canada.


Reclaiming Cree Dignity, A Memoir

мамаsкатсн, darrel J. McLeod's 2018 memoir of growing up Cree in Northern Alberta, was a publishing sensation—winning the Governor General's Literary Award for Non-Fiction, shortlisted for many other major prizes and translated into French and German editions. In Peyakow, McLeod continues the poignant story of his impoverished youth, beset by constant fears of being dragged down by the self-destruction and deaths of those closest to him as he battles the bullying of white classmates, copes with the trauma of physical and sexual abuse, and endures painful separation from his family and culture. With steely determination, he triumphs: now elementary teacher; now school principal; now head of an Indigenous delegation to the UN in Geneva; now executive in the Government of Canada—and now a celebrated author.

Brutally frank but buoyed throughout by McLeod's unquenchable spirit, Peyakow—a title borrowed from the Cree word for "one who walks alone"—is an inspiring account of triumph against unimaginable odds. McLeod's perspective as someone whose career path has crossed both sides of the Indigenous/white chasm resonates with particular force in today's Canada.

A Cree Coming of Age DARREL J. MCLEOD


GROWING UP IN the tiny village of Smith, Alberta, Darrel J. McLeod was surrounded by his Cree family's history. In shifting and unpredictable stories, his mother, Bertha, shared narratives of their culture, their family and the cruelty that she and her sisters endured in residential school. McLeod was comforted by her presence and that of his many siblings and cousins, the smells of moose stew and wild peppermint tea, and his deep love of the landscape. Bertha taught him to be fiercely proud of his heritage and to listen to the birds that would return to watch over and guide him at key

However, in a spiral of events, Darrel's mother turned wild and unstable, and their home life became chaotic. Sweet and innocent by nature, Darrel struggled to maintain his grades and pursue an interest in music while changing homes many times, witnessing violence, caring for his younger siblings and suffering abuse at the hands of his surrogate father. Meanwhile, his sibling's gender transition provoked Darrel to deeply question his own sexual identity.

The fractured narrative of Mamaskatch mirrors Bertha's attempts to reckon with the trauma and abuse she faced in her own life, and captures an intensely moving portrait of a family of strong personalities, deep ties and the shared history that both binds and haunts them.

Beautifully written, honest and thought-provoking, Mamaskatch—named for the Cree word used as a response to dreams shared—is ultimately an uplifting account of overcoming personal and societal obstacles. In spite of the traumas of Darrel's childhood, deep and mysterious forces handed down by his mother helped him survive and thrive: her love and strength stayed with him to build the foundation of what would come to be a very fulfilling and adventurous life.







The panels are filled with colourful and expressive watercolour paintings. The panels of each page, if removed and assembled into one whole image, form a large image reminiscent of a woven robe.

The story follows several historical figures, including Johan Adrian Jacobsen (JAJ), who comes to the Haida village of Masset to collect specimens for a German museum, through a time span that includes first contact, the devastation of the smallpox epidemic, and the mass resettlement of disenfranchised peoples, both Indigenous and European.




Curling Rocks!








A Whole New Game

Economics, Politics, and the Transformation of the Business of Hockey in Canada NEIL LONGLEY

HOCKEY IS STILL Canada's most popular spectator sport. Yet, many fans question how organized hockey serves the country of its origin as they watch the NHL expand ever deeper into an indifferent American south, taking the best young Canadian talent and leaving major Canadian markets in Quebec, the Maritimes and the Prairies in the cold. Minor hockey, once the pride of smaller communities, now serves as a brutal corporate feeder system for the NHL, treating underpaid teenagers like chattel, often shipping players as young as fourteen far away from their homes and families on short notice. Neil Longley contrasts the current state of the game with the way it was before the expansion era, when hockey teams were nurtured and supported at the community level, a system still practiced in much of Europe. In one of the most perceptive and authoritative analyses yet written on modern hockey history, Professor Longley finds no magic formula for putting heart and local pride back in Canada's game, but makes a strong case for placing today's corporate system "in a more realistic, less-Disneyfied, less sanitized, context."

IN 2016, ANN Hui drove across Canada to write about small-town Chinese restaurants and the families who run them. Only after the story was published did she discover her own family could have been included—her parents had run their own Chinese restaurant before she was born. The realization that there was so much of her own history she didn't yet know set her on a mission to understand how her family had wound up in Canada. *Chop Suey Nation* weaves together Hui's family history with the stories of dozens of Chinese restaurant owners from coast to coast: a restaurant owner/small-town mayor; a Chinese restaurant in a Thunder Bay curling rink; the woman who runs a restaurant alone on Fogo Island. Hui also explores the fascinating history behind "shop quar" cuicing datailing the invention of classics like "gingar boof" and

Hui also explores the fascinating history behind "chop suey" cuisine, detailing the invention of classics like "ginger beef" and "Newfoundland chow mein," and other uniquely Canadian fare like the "Chinese pierogies" of Alberta. Hui begins her journey with a somewhat disparaging view of small-town "fake Chinese" food but comes to appreciate the essentially Chinese values that drive these restaurants. She explores the importance of these restaurants in the country's history and makes the case for why chop suey cuisine should be recognized as quintessentially Canadian.


A Deep-Fried Road Trip of Discovery

THE RECIPE IS deceptively simple—fried potatoes, cheese curds, gravy—but the story behind it is as rich and complex as Canada itself. Poutine is the closest thing we have to a national dish. As its popularity has spread across the country and beyond, it has become what the baguette is to France: a kind of national symbol, as immediately Canadian as the toque, beaver or hockey puck. Yet the odd, winding history of poutine has never been written—until now. Following lore about the dish's rise from the road-side chip wagons of rural Quebec, award-winning journalist Justin Giovannetti Lamothe tells a story that mirrors the growth of modern Canada and the shifting cultural gap between La Belle Province and its English-speaking neighbours.

As the son of an anglophone mother and a francophone father, Giovannetti Lamothe is perfectly suited to the task: much of his childhood was spent on the outskirts of Trois-Rivières, a stone's throw from the region where—according to local lore—poutine was invented sometime in the 1950s or '60s. As he tracks poutine's origins and wanderings, he also reveals the evolving nature of his relationship to his father and, with this, to the Québécois heritage he once drifted away from.

In Restaurant Kid, Phan seeks to examine the way her life has been shaped by the rigid boxes placed around her. She had to be a "good daughter," never asking questions, always being grateful. She had to be a "real Canadian," watching hockey and speaking English so flawlessly that her tongue has since forgotten how to contort around Cantonese tones. As the only Chinese girl at school, she had to alternate between being the sidekick, geek, or Asian fetish, depending on whose gaze was on her.

Now, three decades after their restaurant first opened, Phan's parents are cautiously talking about retirement. As an adult, Phan's "good daughter" role demands something new of her—and a chance to get to know her parents away from the restaurant.

In Restaurant Kid, Phan deftly combines candour, wit and insight to craft a vibrant and important narrative on the strength and foibles of family, and how we come to understand ourselves.




The Battles of a Feminist, Union Leader and Politician JUDY DARCY

AS THIS RICH memoir shows, the life of activist, union leader and legislator Judy Darcy mirrors many of the great social and political currents of the modern era. Years later, after moving from Ontario to British Columbia, she is elected to public office, becoming an NDP MLA. Here, as the only North American minister of mental health and addictions, she confronted the ravages of the toxic-drug crisis, working to help some of society's most vulnerable.

Throughout the tumultuous events of her career and personal life, Darcy is forever working for those on the margins, fighting to protect workers' rights, water rights, health care, childcare and reproductive choice, and helping secure a landmark Supreme Court decision in favour of same-sex partner pensions. Powered by intense conviction and intimately personal experience, her candid story offers a vision of a new kind of leadership, steeped in compassion and able to negotiate the most urgent and complex challenges of our fractured era.






Dear Da-Lê

A Father's Memoir of the Vietnam War and the Iranian Revolution ANH DUONG WITH A FOREWORD BY ASHLEY DA-LÊ DUONG SPANNING DECADES AND generations, this heartfelt memoir began as a series of letters from a worried father. Anh Duong had witnessed terrible things as a child during the Vietnam War, and later as a refugee in Iran during the revolution of the late 1970s. But like many in the Vietnamese diaspora, he had remained silent about his experiences, believing that trauma was better left unspoken. However, when his daughter became involved in student protests, Duong felt compelled to speak about his own experience of uprisings.

In precise prose, Dear Da-Lê moves along a taut narrative thread that begins with Duong's birth in 1953 and ends with his arrival, frayed and broke, in Canada in 1980. With surprising moments of hope and tenderness amid brutal divisions, the author creates a coming-of-age story intertwined with the human costs of war and exile. Its revelations are sure to resonate not only with the generation born to refugees of the Vietnam War, but with anyone seeking to understand the lasting, often hidden torments of violent conflict and the healing that can take place in the act of telling.


The Animal People Choose a Leader

After hearing boasts about the qualities of the candidates—Horse's fleetness, Buffalo's stamina, Cougar's patience, Wolverine's stealth—the conference decides to settle the matter with a race between the challengers around a foreboding mountaintop lake. And there will be one more contestant of the most unlikely sort: a small, charmingly humble rabbit named Waabooz, whose chances are considered slim by all.

In the action that follows, described with the piercing clarity and richness of any great legend, Wagamese and George gracefully convey the limits of physical force and the quietly irresistible energies of humility, empathy and a loving attachment to the land. Unforgettable for its lyrical power and poignant message, The Animal People Choose a Leader is yet another example of the late author's unique gifts as a storyteller, and a welcome reminder of his honoured place in Canadian writing.
