Buffalo Lessons

How Bison Returned to Banff National Park

The breathtaking true story of how wild bison returned to the Rockies after 150 years, defying human expectations at every turn.

BUFFALO LESSONS is a riveting inside account of one of the most ambitious wildlife conservation projects in North American history: the reintroduction of plains bison to Banff National Park in 2017. Once nearly driven to extinction, these iconic animals were brought back to their ancestral home in a tale brimming with unexpected challenges and profound revelations.

Karsten Heuer, the conservationist tasked with leading the project, packs his narrative with phenomenal photos and thrilling moments: a helicopter-assisted translocation into the rugged backcountry, a horseback chase to tranquilize a bison, and the tense tracking of wayward bulls that scale steep, treacherous terrain. Across his adventures, Heuer weaves in Indigenous perspectives, honoring the spiritual and historical ties between the animals and the land.

Completed just before his death in 2024, Heuer's last book is a captivating exploration of the delicate balance between human intervention and the untamed wilderness.


KARSTEN HEUER was a conservationist, biologist, author, and filmmaker. Heuer authored *Walking the Big Wild* and *Being Caribou* and received the Wilburforce Foundation Conservation Leadership Award. He passed away in November 2024, shortly after completing the manuscript for *Buffalo Lessons*.

LEROY LITTLE BEAR is a Blackfoot leader, scholar, and advocate. He is a coauthor of the Buffalo Treaty, a recipient of the Alberta Order of Excellence, and an Officer of the Order of Canada.

HARVEY LOCKE is a globally renowned expert on national parks and large landscape conservation. He lives in Banff National Park.

From a distinctive new voice in nature writing comes a poetic exploration of life at the precarious edge of nature and human settlement.

ON A SMALL acreage teeming with wild and domestic animals, buzzing with a half-million honey bees, and dotted with fruit trees-including one affectionately named Bill-lives beekeeper-poet Susan Cormier. Circling the farm, an aggressive tangle of forest and blackberry vines thrives, but beyond, the shadow of urban development creeps ever closer. Over five seasons, Cormier takes readers through the rhythms of semi-agricultural life, reflecting on the dichotomy between beauty and grief, loss and renewal, and humor and the often heart-wrenching realities of animal existence in an agrarian landscape.

Lyrical and poignant, Dead Bees Still Sting is a moving meditation on the cycles of nature, vulnerability, persistence, and survival. Above all, it is a celebration of what it means to belong to a place, to witness its changes, and to find beauty and meaning in the ongoing conversation between humans and nature.

SUSAN CORMIER is a spoken word artist, filmmaker, beekeeper, and caretaker of assorted small critters. Her lyrical essay "Advice to a New Beekeeper" won the CBC Nonfiction Prize, and her writing has appeared in numerous publications and anthologies. Cormier produces Vancouver Story Slam, Canada's longest-running live indie storytelling competition.

My Life With Wolves

How I Became the Storyteller for the Yellowstone Packs


RICK MCINTYRE has been a voice for wolves for over forty years speaking for the wolves to international media outlets, to Yellowstone tourists on the roadside, and to the readers of his bestselling books. Now, in My Life With Wolves, McIntyre finally shares his own story, revealing the events and influences in his early life that shaped his core values and led to him working for the National Park Service, including in Denali, Glacier, and Yellowstone national parks. He tells of his wrestling background, his early work as a bouncer, and his empathy for misunderstood or unfairly persecuted creatures. Later in life, in moments when quiet courage was called for, McIntyre often drew on lessons he'd learned from observing animals in the wild, especially his beloved wolves. My Life With Wolves highlights his distinct spirit, his wisdom, and his contributions to wolf science, all while sharing his passion and gentle wit with readers.

RICK MCINTYRE is a former longtime park ranger and the author of the Alpha Wolves of Yellowstone books series for adults and its companion series for kids, The Chronicles of the Yellowstone Wolves. Celebrated as the most prolific wolf researcher in the world, McIntyre has been profiled by media outlets like This American Life and National Geographic; has been awarded conservation medals; was a key player in the successful reintroduction of wolves to Yellowstone in 1995; and forever changed the way the world views alpha wolves through his public speaking and writing. McIntyre is retired from the National Park Service but still rises early to observe the Yellowstone wolves every day of the week.


